SUMMARY

The Painter is responsible for refinishing damaged body parts and bodies of vehicles in accordance with factory and dealership quality specifications and time standards.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- Assists and trains the lesser skilled team members on best practices.
- Removes rust from metal, and grease and dirt from work surface.
- Follows manufacturer's standard operating procedures for product use.
- Masks and protects parts that are not to be painted or coated.
- Fills cavities and dents with appropriate filler to attain smooth surface.
- Mixes paint according to specifications.
- Mixes all paint products across the scale.
- Paints surface using sprayer or brush as appropriate.
- Inspects painted units for quality of workmanship, noting any runs, sags, and unpainted areas.
- Cooperates and assists other personnel in the repair and prepping of vehicles.
- Notifies parts coordinator of material stock quantity concerns.
- Maintains tools and keeps equipment clean and in a proper state of repair including the paint booth and mix room.
- Keeps work area clean. Puts paint stands and ladders away when not in use.
- Maintains and wears all required safety and health personal protective equipment, including respirator, in the manner recommended by the equipment manufacturer.
- Complies with all laws and regulations pertaining to paint, thinners, product disposal and other hazardous materials. Reports any deviations to management.
- Keeps abreast of new products and advancements in technology and makes recommendations to management.
- Understands, keeps abreast of, and complies with federal, state, and local regulations that affect body shop operations, such as hazardous waste disposal, OSHA Right-to-Know, etc.
- Follows all shop SOPs.

- Follows all safety rules to maintain a safe work environment including wearing all required personal protective equipment and using shop tools and equipment properly and safely.
- Reports any safety issues immediately to Management.
- Follows the Company's Culture and Mission Statement.
- Maintains a positive attitude focused on constant self-improvement.
